Title: The fragility of the mountains. Feasibility study for the recovery of areas within the 2016 earthquake crater.

Offer description:

The research aims at linking up with the National Strategy for Inner Areas (SNAI) and, therefore, envisages a preliminary work phase on the risk/hazard relationship by classifying geographical areas according to their distance from the distribution centres of civil protection services and interventions. To this end, the use of GIS geotechnologies and the setting up of a database capable of storing and returning the collected data responds to a need inherent in strategies aimed at supporting "fragile territories" which, according to SNAI indications, cover 60% of the national territory.

The investigation of the level of territorial connection is also fundamental to implement any plan for the reappropriation of the so-called 'middle lands' and 'high lands' which, after the 2016 earthquake, have recorded an accentuation of demographic drainage, on which the negative perception of the 'stability of the temporary' still acts. In order to halt and reverse this phenomenon, a qualitative survey phase is envisaged to detect the intentions of insiders and focus on bottom-up decision-making dynamics that enhance the socio-cultural resources traceable to the notion of genius loci.

A third phase aims at fostering economic susceptibility by drawing up innovative and sustainable proposals for the tourist use of environmental and cultural resources, with a synergic connection to the actions of the various types of existing parks.
